



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Step 01

Evaluate your Needs

This employee will systematically go through all of the training, starting with the 101 courses, then the PM responsibilities, systems, glass products, etc. This is the easiest of the paths to set up internally.

Outside PM - Bring them into the World of Glass

An employee with a PM background but no glazing experience is going to benefit most from starting with glazing products that they are unfamiliar with such as the systems and glass components they will be in charge of taking off and ordering. Experienced project managers can benefit from our more advanced courses as well.

Smart Sales People = Happy Customers = More Sales

LearnGlazing.com is an excellent resource to increase the overall knowledge of your sales staff. 
Step Two

Assign Training Based on Staff Role





Step 03

Review and Evaluate

Identify a Training Lead - Let the team at LearnGlazing.com know who will be responsible for tracking student progress. The Training Lead or Group Analyst will have the ability to see their team's progress in the admin dashboard. It will be important to assign a "training leader" to discuss the training with the students each week, monitor their progress and help bridge the gap between the training and the specifics of what makes your company successful.



Schedule Timely Discussions - Help students draw parallels between the LearnGlazing.com training material and your business.
